EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Blue Origin's New Glenn heavy-lift rocket suffered a catastrophic explosion during a full-stack static fire test at Launch Complex 36, Cape Canaveral, on 28 May 2026 (~9:00 PM EDT). The vehicle was preparing for NG-4 – the **first dedicated New Glenn mission carrying Amazon LEO satellites** (~48 planned). The first stage was destroyed, with significant pad and ground-support damage. No injuries.



Blue Origin's New Glenn Rocket Explodes at Cape Canaveral

Your Direct Exposure | This explosion severs Amazon's primary high-capacity launch pathway for its 3,236-satellite Kuiper/LEO constellation. With only ~300+ satellites currently in orbit and a firm contract for 12 New Glenn flights, downstream risks include launch-slot shortages, manufacturing backlogs, FCC milestone pressure (50% deployment deadline: 30 July 2026), insurance hardening, and intensified competition from Starlink and for similar resources.

AMAZON LEO / KUIPER SUPPLY-CHAIN IMPACT

New Glenn was Amazon's contracted workhorse (each launch is 48–61 satellites). NG-4 loss forces full pivot to lower-capacity alternatives (ULA, Arianespace) with constrained manifests.
